


#### THE HUMAN COST OF THE WAR

- □ More than 20 million deaths and 21 million wounded.

The Central Powers lost about 4 million soldiers.











At the end of the war there were more than 500 functioning Soldiers Houses

a total of 280.096 children from needy families, most of which in the South of Italy.


